Hand Expression

Why hand expression?

Hand expression is an easy, efficient way to express breast milk. It doesn't require any special equipment or even electricity. It has also been shown to double the volume of milk pumped when used in combination with pumping via a mechanical breast pump. Unlike mechanical pumping, hand expression mimics the way that baby eats. To boost milk supply with mechanical pumping, try hand expression before, during and/or after a mechanical pumping session. Even thirty seconds of hand expression combined with mechanical pumping can increase the amount pumped.

Thaw milk in refrigerator overnight or place in warm water. Swirl to mix. Never use a microwave or stovetop to heat milk!

How to hand express

- 1) Wash your hands
- 2) Gently massage your breast
- 3) Place thumb and index finger on either side of the nipple, about 1-2 inches back from the nipple.
- 4) Press gently inward toward the rib cage
- 5) Roll fingers together in a slight downward motion
- 6) Repeat all around the nipple if desired
- 7) Use a cup, bowl or bottle to easily catch the milk
